



WELCOME TO THE TWIN CITIES


It is always exciting to get together at the AMPO Annual Conference to share our successes, discuss our challenges and form relationships that will aid all of us as we build out our nation's transportation infrastructure. We are honored to

host the 2022 event on the 60th anniversary of the 1962 Federal-Aid Highway Act that created MPOs for regional transportation planning. I would like to personally thank everyone involved in putting this conference together.

The Metropolitan Council of the Twin Cities is a unique organization because we're both an MPO and a transit operator, as well as the primary planning agency for the seven-county metropolitan area. We also operate one of the nation's most efficient and cost-effective wastewater treatment systems. The Minnesota Legislature has invested us with these duties because it saw a need for a single entity to address regional issues, too big for any one city or county to do alone.

How do we make our communities equitable and inclusive place to live and prosper? I believe this conference will highlight the ways we can all be part of the solution.

The Twin Cities region is building out a system of new rapid transitways. We've recently begun service on our METRO Orange Line bus rapid transit. The Federal Transit Administration has awarded a letter of no prejudice for our METRO Gold Line bus rapid transit project, which will operate mostly in dedicated guideways. We have two arterial bus rapid transit routes in operation, and several in various stages of planning and development. Fast and frequent, all-day rapid transit service held on to the most ridership during the pandemic and is the best opportunity for enticing choice riders back to our system.

During your stay here, I hope you have an opportunity to use our transit system to explore our region. We are offering free transit passes so you can see our system firsthand. We are also offering bus rapid transit tours on our operating lines. Transit also connects us to a world class regional park system that has more visitors than Yellowstone, Yosemite and the Grand Canyon combined, at the same time linking us to incredible local culture, sporting, and shopping.

But the real attraction of this event is the incredible line up of speakers who are on the cutting edge of work being done by MPOs across the nation. This is a chance for us to learn new things, find inspiration, and build friendships and partnerships that benefit every part of the nation.

FEATURED SPEAKER Dr. Kate Beane

Dr. Kate Beane holds a PhD in American Studies from the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities. She is the Executive Director of the Minnesota Museum of American Art, and serves as adjunct faculty in American Indian Studies at the University of Minnesota. In 2019, Dr. Beane presented

a Minneapolis TEDX talk titled "The Lasting Legacy of Place Names" helping to educate the public on the name restoration process of Bde Maka Ska, her ancestral village site, and the largest lake in south Minneapolis.

Names hold meaning, and public places carry the memories of many generations. As the Indigenous peoples of Mni Sota, all too often Dakota peoples' contributions to the state and region are not adequately acknowledged. Sometimes a change in process or policy is required to become more welcoming in public spaces, and there are steps we can each take to be more inclusive of American Indian peoples and Nations. We are the original stewards of these lands, and our languages, cultural traditions, and stories must be told on our own terms and in our own voices.
