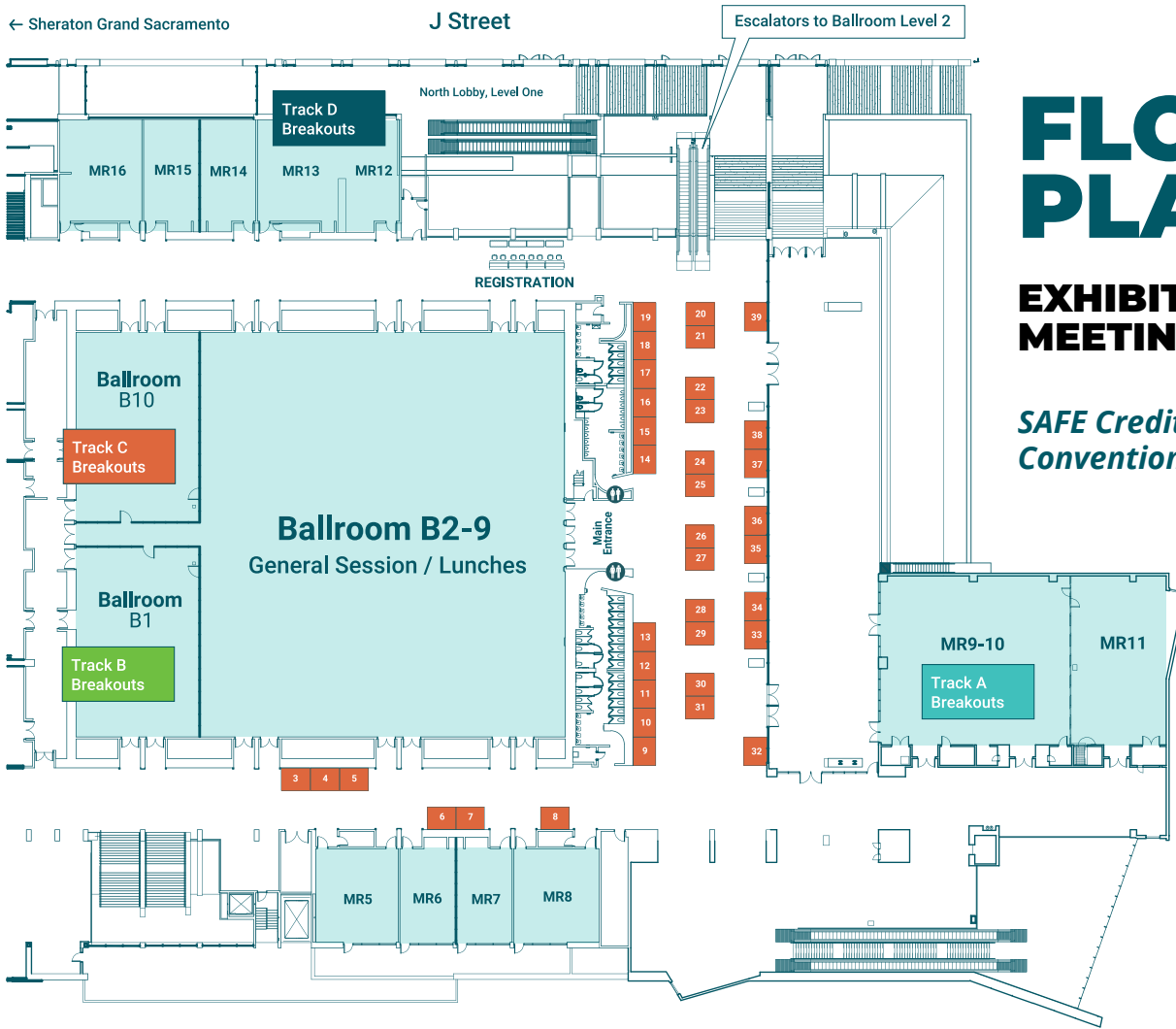

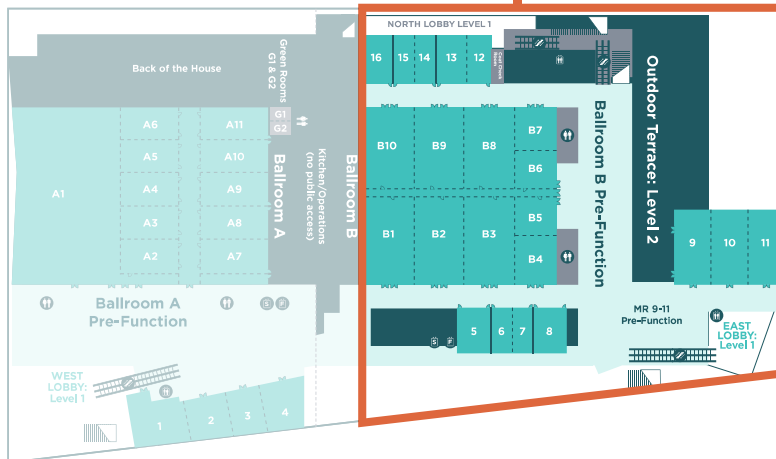


FLOOR PLAN
